NCF 35th Annual General Meeting



The Nigerian Conservation Foundation (NCF) on Wednesday 2nd October 2024, reiterated its commitment to environmental conservation and sustainability during the 35th Annual General Meeting held in Lagos.

The Director-General of NCF, Dr Joseph Onoja, said that 2023 marked the foundation's third year of the implementation of its Strategic Action Plan (SAP 2021- 2025). He also mentioned that the Foundation became more focused and innovative and implemented impactful programmes and projects on environmental sustainability and nature conservation.

NCF/MTN Pachi Panda Challenge



Osarode Stephen Odemwingie emerged as the winner of the NCF/MTN Pachi Panda Challenge taking home a \\$3 million cash prize. He will proudly represent Nigeria at the Africa PachiPanda Challenge Grand Finale in South Africa. The second and third positions were claimed by Olabisi Rafatu Emmanuel and the Sparkwise Initiative Team, with cash prizes of \\$2 million and \\$1.5 million, respectively.

The Nigeria PachiPanda Challenge is part of the Africa PachiPanda Challenge, a joint initiative of MTN Global and World Wildlife Fund (WWF). The PachiPanda Challenge was launched to inspire and support innovative solutions addressing pressing environmental challenges across the African continent.

NCF Hosts Annual Green Ball 2024: Embracing Wellness and Nature

NCF holds 2024 NEC Strategy Retreat For 2025-2030 SAP

From October 31st to November 2nd, 2024, the Nigerian Conservation Foundation (NCF) hosted a 3-day strategic retreat session that brought together the Board of Trustees, the National Executive Council, and Senior Management staff of the Foundation to develop new and robust Strategic Action Plans (SAP) that will provide new strategic direction for the Foundation from 2025-2030. The new SAP that came out of the retreat session will be launched in 2025 and is expected to serve as a guide and compass for the Foundation to deliver impactful environmental projects and foster public and private sector conservations towards a better environment.





Five UNICAL students bag scholarships to study Cross River gorilla habits



Nigeria Conservation Foundation in partnership with Wilder Institute/Calgary Zoo has offered a scholarship award to four Masters' and one PhD students of the University of Calabar to research on the Cross River Afi Mountain gorillas.

The students were awarded the scholarship to study the habits of the Cross River gorillas living in the Afi Mountain and their relationship with the locals from the communities scouring the mountain The program is funded by the Wilder Institute Calgary Zoo in partnership with six other partners, the NCF being the principal implementing partners for this program in Nigeria.

NCF, Omo Forest Reserve Team Participated in the Wildlife Ranger Challenge

The NCF team, Omo Forest Elephant Initiative, in the Omo Forest Reserve, Ogun State, joined thousands of other participants from across Africa in the 2024 #WildlifeRangerChallenge, organized by TUSK and the Game Rangers' Association of Africa.

This year marked our team's first attempt at the event. They took on a series of mental and physical challenges, culminating in the final event on September 21st, where each competing ranger ran a 21km race while carrying a 22kg backpack.

The aim of WRC is to communicate rangers' varied roles and multiple challenges, raise vital funds for rangers' frontline conservation work, and foster connection and friendship among the participants.



Nigeria Army Heritage and Future Centre Visits NCF



On Thursday, 5th December 2024, the Nigerian Army Heritage and Future Centre paid a courtesy visit to the NCF to strengthen partnerships on biodiversity conservation and sustainable development. Dr. Joseph Onoja, shared insights on:

Update: Lagos Free Zone and the Nigerian Conservation Foundation Sea Turtle Conservation Project

Recent activities from the NCF/LFZ Sea Turtle Conservation Project highlight the impactful work of the community-based volunteers in Ibeju Lekki, particularly in communities around the operational areas of the Lagos Free Zone.

Trained to monitor nesting sea turtles, protect their eggs, and rescue bycatch, these volunteers have been actively involved in advocacy, beach monitoring, and educational outreach within their communities.

A total of 108 local participants, including fisherfolks, were educated on the ecological importance of sea turtles and the need for their protection to promote biodiversity and sustainable ecotourism.

The continued efforts of these volunteers underscore the crucial role of local involvement in sea turtle conservation.

To further advance the sea turtle conservation awareness in Ibeju Lekki, we expanded our community based school engagement in October by engaging seven government schools and reaching about 3,250 students across the community.







WALK FOR NATURE 2024





On Saturday, 19th October, we held the 18th edition of Walk for Nature, themed "Land Restoration, Desertification, and Drought Resilience," at Onikan Stadium Lagos, in partnership with Lagos State Ministry of the Environment and Water Resources.

Since 2008, we have collaborated with Lagos State Government to raise public awareness about the importance of environmental protection and conservation through the #WalkForNature event.

This year's theme underscores the urgent need to restore degraded lands, combat desertification, and build resilience to drought—key steps in protecting ecosystems and ensuring sustainable livelihoods for future generations.

As part of our implementation plan for the NCF/NABU project; a forest management and livelihood improvement project in Cross River State, we held capacity building workshop to train beneficiaries on Value Addition for Non-Timber Forest Products.

NABU Team Paid Visit to NCF

We had the honour of welcoming the team from Nature and Biodiversity Conservation Union (NABU) to NCF Headquarters on 19th November.

In 2023, we embarked on a transformative 3-year project in Cross River State, Nigeria, aimed at enhancing forest management and improving livelihoods.

This initiative, carried out in partnership with NABU and supported by funding from BMZ BUND, focuses on conserving 12,000 hectares in the buffer zone of Cross River National Park while improving people's livelihood in 8 local communities of Cross River State.

We have seen remarkable progress, with lives and communities thriving through the collaboartion efforts.

Kainji Lake Project Update



We launched an innovative initiative to provide alternative livelihoods and empowerment for hunters and women groups surrounding Kainji Lake National Park.

This project aims to harmonize human activities with conservation efforts, ensuring the long-term preservation of critically endangered species like lions and leopards.

Kainji Lake National Park is faced with significant security challenges, limiting access to over 30 surrounding communities. To address this, we recently conducted a 5-day workshop, gathering 150 participants for hands-on training to equip hunters and women with skills to improve their financial stability.

Participants were trained on beekeeping, grass cutter rearing, and shea butter production.





Also, a transformative shift took place. The Nigerian Conservation Foundation has bridged the divide through its innovative Site Support Groups (SSGs). Hunters, once at odds with rangers, now embrace them as allies under the banner, "Reformed Hunters." These groups work hand-in-hand with rangers to safeguard the park's precious wildlife.

Through our Site Support Groups, we have successfully transformed a once-contentious relationship into a powerful partnership, ensuring the long-term protection of Kainji Lake National Park's ecosystem.
